# Social Equity Program Overview



### Business, Licensing, and Compliance Assistance

- The BLC program will provide Social Equity Applicants with programming and training in the areas of state and local licensing requirements, commercial cannabis regulations, general business development, cannabis-specific business development and workforce development.
- This curricula will be available **Summer 2021**. Stay tuned!





## Social Equity Program: Fee Deferral Program & Fee Waiver Program



In April 2021, City Council approved DCR's Rules and Regulations for the Fee Deferral and Fee Waiver Program.

#### **Fee Deferral Program**

To date, DCR has made \$250,000 available to verified Social Equity Applicants through the Fee Deferral Program. Additional Fee Deferrals will be made available as resources allow.

#### Fee Waiver Program

DCR will make an additional \$650,000 available for fee waivers. Fee waivers may be applied to Social Equity Application (SEIA) Eligibility Verification Fees for individuals who submit a complete eligibility verification application. More details are forthcoming.



### Social Equity Program: SEED Grant Program



The Financial Grant Program is now the **Social Equity Entrepreneur Development (SEED) Grant Program.** 

- In April 2021, the City of Los Angeles established the Social Equity Entrepreneur Development Grant Program (SEED) Grant Program).
- The SEED Grant Program utilizes funding from the <u>Cannabis Equity Grant for Local Jurisdictions</u> (<u>CEG Grant</u>) to provide financial assistance to verified Social Equity Individual Applicants.
- To date, the City of Los Angeles has dedicated **\$6 million** towards the SEED Grant Program through funds made available through 2019 and 2020 California CEG Grant awards.

### Social Equity Program: Pro Bono Legal Services



The Los Angeles County Bar Association's Cannabis Section, in partnership with DCR, has created a Pro Bono Legal Assistance program which will operate through the Bar Association's Smart Law Referral Service for Social Equity Applicants. This referral service is available ONLY to Social Equity Applicants who applied in Phase 3 Retail Round 1 and were determined eligible for further processing. Depending on demand and availability, these services may be expanded to other applicants in the future.
