
Program Updates: SPARK Sessions



SPARK SESSIONS were virtual events dedicated to a specific topic DCR is seeking community feedback on including Licensing and Regulation, the Social Equity Program, Corporate Social Responsibility, and Community Impact.

SPARK SESSIONS #2 - #7 included a Stakeholder Comment Period, which provided opportunities for participants to share feedback. In addition, SESSIONS #5 - #8 included breakout rooms that allowed for direct feedback and recommendations from participants. During the breakout rooms, we heard from participants and included their ideas and suggestions on whiteboards as graphical representations.

Program Updates: SPARK Surveys and SPARK Comment Box

Summary of Activities to Date: Policy



Local, State, and/or Federal

On June 28, 2021, the Governor signed the state budget which included provisions to consolidate the three state cannabis licensing agencies into the one Department of Cannabis Control and included funding intended to aid local agencies to move applicants through the state Annual Licensing process.

Amendments to Articles 4 and 5 of Chapter X of the Los Angeles Municipal Code related to licensing and land use restrictions.

Local, State, and/or Federal

On July 4, 2021, ordinance amendments to the document requirement for temporary approval related to proof of deposit for Phase 3 Retail Round 1 Applicants became effective. Those amendments also extended the cannabis application renewal fee payment deadline for all applicants for years 2019, 2020, and 2021 until July 31, 2021.

On June 22, the City Council adopted additional Amendments to Articles 4 and 5 of Chapter X of the Los Angeles Municipal Code related to licensing and land use restrictions. These amendments became effective on July 1, 2021.

Amendments to Articles 4 and 5 of Chapter X of the Los Angeles Municipal Code related to licensing and land use restrictions.

Highlights of Amendments to Article 4, Chapter X, Ordinance 187,095 (Adopted June 22, 2021; Effective July 1, 2021)

104.03	 Added a <u>civil judgement concerning illegal Commercial Cannabis Activity</u> as a reason to disqualify Primary Personnel from applying for, or holding a License. Added <u>padlocking at a site</u> as a reason to make a Business Premises ineligible for Licensure. PCN process requires that the applicant submit a Pre-Application to determine compliance of the location. Relocation modification language was clarified to allow P3RR1 Applicants to submit one request to relocate prior to December 31, 2021 and not be subject to the relocation fee and establishes the Application Date. Applicants with TA are required to cancel their current TA before DCR may issue a new one when relocating. Allowable physical modification to a Business Premises increased to 50% of the existing floor area or 2,500 sf. 				
104.06	 Changes to the Temporary Approval requirements. Penalties added if an Applicant is in violation of operational or permitting requirements. 				
104.06.1	Minor clarification to the procedure related to Phase 3 Retail Round 2 provided.				
104.20	Reorganized portions of the Equity Share requirements.

Amendments to Articles 4 and 5 of Chapter X of the Los Angeles Municipal Code related to licensing and land use restrictions.

Highlights of Amendments to **Article 5**, Chapter X, Ordinance <u>187,094</u> (Adopted June 22, 2021; Effective July 1, 2021)

105.01	Clarified the definitions for the various sensitive uses and established how to identify a sensitive use.					
105.02	 Clarified <u>when</u> another retailer or microbusiness commercial cannabis activity has "planted its flag" at a location which would impact a new retailer or microbusiness commercial cannabis activity business seeking a license within 700 feet. Clarified how to measure the distance between a commercial cannabis activity business and a sensitive use or between two commercial cannabis activity businesses. It establishes that an proposed location is deemed compliant with the required distances in Sec 105.02 from a Sensitive Use when that Sensitive Use is "Publicly Available" to DCR on the "Verification Date". 					
105.03	 Extended the date for EMMDs with a City License for Commercial Cannabis Activity to comply with zone, distance and Sensitive Use restrictions until <u>December 31, 2025</u>, provided they remain at the same location and in compliance with Proposition D distance and Sensitive Use restrictions. After December 31, 2025, these EMMDs must comply with current zoning requirements and Prop D distancing to Sensitive Uses unless the business is relocated. If the business relocates it must comply with zoning and sensitive use restrictions per LAMC 105.

Licensing Program Updates:



Phase 3 Retail Round 1 Application Processing Update

To date:

77 businesses have uploaded one or more Temporary Approval documents.

48 of the 77 businesses have uploaded the minimum number of completed Temporary Approval documents and are eligible for a status of "Local Compliance Underway".

- 25 of the 48 businesses have scheduled an Initial DCR Inspection.
- 24 of the 25 have passed an Initial DCR Inspection.
- 10 Phase 3 Retail Round 1 Applicants have received Temporary Approval.

General Licensing Program Reminders



- DCR Licensing Portal Functionality associated with the submission of new Pre-Application records may be offline until October 1, 2021.
- Other functionality may be taken offline, from time to time, to amend the system to reflect recently adopted laws.
- Process modifications for the Pre-Application Review Record, Temporary Approval Application Record, Annual Application Record, Modification Record, PCN Request Record, and Appeal Record are underway.
- DCR provides services <u>after</u> application and or licensing records are FILED. Filing requires that the record is successfully submitted <u>and</u> all applicable fees are paid. Unless an eligibility determination is required by law prior to invoicing, DCR will not provide feedback and/or review a record until it has been filed.
- All service requests submitted on or after September 1, 2021 must be paid in full and be remitted with all required information to be deemed filed. Incomplete requests will not be deemed filed.

Licensing Program: Reminders and Recent Communications Renewal Extension



On May 11, 2021, the Los Angeles City Council approved Ordinance 187058 (the "Ordinance") that allows for a one-time late submission of 2019, 2020 and/or 2021 renewal applications and related renewal fees, among other items. The Ordinance became effective on July 4, 2021.

Both a renewal application and renewal fees must be submitted by July 31, 2021.

Applicants who do not pay their fees and submit an application will: (1) no longer have local authorization; (2) will be required to cease operations; (3) will have a status of "expired License"; and, (4) will not be allowed to engage in Commercial Cannabis Activity until a new application is submitted to DCR and a new Temporary Approval or License is issued.

Licensing Program: Reminders and Recent Communications Proof of Deposit

Ordinance 187058 removed "proof of deposit" as a standalone application requirement for Phase 3 Retail Round 1 and allowed DCR to re-review applications denied in Phase 3 Retail Round 1 due to the failure to include a separate proof of deposit.

DCR completed its review of four Phase 3 Retail Round 1 (P3RR1) applications deemed ineligible due to the failure to include a separate proof of deposit, DCR has invoiced all four businesses. If the invoices are timely paid, the applications will be deemed filed and be included in future P3RR1 reporting.

These applications do not count toward undue concentration.

Licensing Program: Reminders and Recent Communications PCN Denial

PCN Requests - If the Los Angeles City Council does not adopt a finding of public convenience or necessity (PCN) on an Applicant's PCN request within 90 calendar days of the City Clerk's date of receipt of the PCN request, the PCN request is denied by operation of law.

Licensing Program Updates: Reminders and Recent Communications Phase 2 Deadlines

Phase 2 Applicant who failed to receive Temporary Approval by <u>June 30, 2021</u>, lost their local authorization provided under LAMC section 104.08(a) as of July 1, 2021. By virtue of losing this local authorization, an Applicant also lost their ability to assert limited immunity by operation of law under LAMC Section 104.08(c).

DCR is adjusting the deadline which would have required Phase 2 applicants to obtain Temporary Approval by September 30, 2021 or have their Application deemed abandoned. All Applicants that have not been granted Temporary Approval by September 30, 2021 shall: (1) upload all Temporary Approval documents to their DCR record by September 30, 2021; (2) have a modification request that was **approved** between January 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021; or (3) have a **pending** modification request submitted by September 30, 2021. Phase 2 records that do not comply with one of these requirements by September 30, 2021, shall be deemed abandoned under LAMC section 104.03(h). All applicable payment, filing, and/or document submission requirement deadlines still apply.

SEED: Background



- In April 2021, the City of Los Angeles established the Social Equity Entrepreneur Development Grant Program (SEED) Grant Program formerly known as the Financial Grant Program.
- To date, the City of Los Angeles has dedicated \$ 6 million to the SEED Grant Program.
 - \$5 million available via SEED 1.0
 - \$1 million available via SEED 2.0



SEED 1.0



- Total amount available: \$5 million
- Grant Eligibility: Phase 3 Retail Round 1 Social Equity Individual Applicants deemed eligible pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code 104.06.1(b)
- Grant Amount: \$25,000



SEED 2.0



- Total Amount Available: \$1 million
- Grant Eligibility: verified Social Equity Individual Applicants
- Grant Amount: a total of \$10,000 available in two disbursements:
 - (1) \$5,000 when DCR deems the Pre-Application eligible for further processing;
 and
 - (2) \$5,000 when the Applicant is eligible for a Notice of Local Compliance Underway







Assessment Documents

- Applicants are uploading "Business Plans".
 - The SEED Assessment Documents call for Applicants to provide an "Executive Business Summary" (3-5 Pages)
- Applicants are uploading "Budgets for their entire business"
 - The SEED Assessment Document calls for a budget for the "Grant" amount only.
 - SEED 1.0 \$25,000
 - SEED 2.0 (2) \$5,000 Disbursements

Deadlines and Pro Rata Disbursement

The Deadline to Apply for the SEED Grant Program is August 18, 2021.

Any remaining funds that have not been disbursed 90 days prior to the end of the Grant Term with the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development will be disbursed on a <u>pro rata basis</u> to eligible applicants who applied before the deadline.
