SEIA Eligibility Verification Process



- In 2020, the City Council mandated that retail, delivery and cultivation licensing activities are restricted to verified Social Equity Applicants through Jan 1, 2025.
- The 60-day eligibility verification period will be only eligibility verification period in 2022; if you do not get verified during this eligibility verification period, you will not be able to submit your eligibility verification request until the process reopens in 2023 or later.
- Social Equity Individual Applicants (SEIA) verified under the updated criteria with a qualifying prior California Cannabis Arrest or Conviction may register for the Phase 3 Retail Round 2 lottery.

SEIA Eligibility Verification Criteria



- To qualify as a Social Equity Individual Applicant (SEIA), an individual must meet, at least, two of the following three criteria:
 - (1) Low-Income in 2020 or 2021;
 - (2) a prior California Cannabis Arrest or Conviction prior to November 8, 2016;
 - An arrest, prosecution or conviction for a violation of Proposition D <u>is not</u> a California Arrest or Cannabis Conviction.
 - (3) ten years' cumulative residency in a Disproportionately Impacted Area.



SEIA Eligibility Verification Criteria Low Income in 2020 or 2021

- Social Equity Individual Applicant meets the low-income thresholds established in the annual U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income limits based upon the Area Median Income (AMI) for Los Angeles County based on household size; and,
- The SEIA's net assets at, or below, four times the Low-Income thresholds based on the individual's Household Size. Examples of liquid accounts that shall be disclosed include but are not limited to, saving accounts, checking accounts, certificates of deposit, money market accounts, stocks, trusts, and gifts.


SEIA Eligibility Verification Criteria CA Cannabis Arrest or Conviction


- "California Cannabis Arrest or Conviction" means an arrest or conviction in California for any crime under the laws of the State of California or the United States relating to the sale, possession, use, manufacture, or cultivation of Cannabis that occurred **prior to November 8, 2016**.
 - An arrest, prosecution or conviction for a violation of Proposition D is not a California Arrest or Cannabis Conviction.
- A Social Equity Applicant with a California Cannabis Arrest or Conviction shall be ineligible to apply for a License in any of the circumstances specified in Section 104.03(a), subject to the time restrictions therein.



• "Disproportionately Impacted Area" means Police Reporting Districts as established in the <u>Expanded Social Equity Analysis</u>, or as established using the same methodology and criteria in a similar analysis provided by an Applicant for an area outside of the City.











The goals of this referral resource are to promote fair and equitable participation in the litensed commercial cannabis industry, and to foster a level playing field as it relates to access to legal counsel, and help deter predatory practices targeting the social equity community.

This referral service is available ONLY to Social Equity Applicants who applied in Phase 3 Retain Round 1 and were determined eligible for further processing under Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 104.06.1(b). Depending on demand and availability, these services may be expanded to other applicants in the future.
