Dear Commission members,

I am writing on behalf of the Board and members of the South Brentwood Residents Association (“SBRA”), which represents approximately 18,000 homeowners and renters who reside in the area south of San Vicente Blvd., north of Wilshire Blvd. (including the north side of Wilshire Blvd.), east of Centinela Ave. and west of Federal Ave., including all residents living in multi-family dwellings throughout the entire Brentwood community.

In addition to being the local residents group covering this project and the area immediately to the north of it, SBRA is also a member of the Brentwood Community Council (BCC), which is the umbrella group for all of Brentwood incorporating 13 homeowners’ associations, multi-family residential dwellers, business organizations, schools, religious groups, volunteer service groups, public safety and environmental organizations. As such, the BCC’s area also covers this project. Per correspondence submitted by the BCC on this project, the Los Angeles City Council has designated the BCC as the equivalent of a neighborhood council for land use and related issues coming before the City Council.

We very much appreciate that following our request for an additional public meeting that we could publicize to our community, the applicant agreed to hold such a meeting on June 27. We sent out multiple notices about this public meeting to the SBRA email list and the BCC sent notice to their list as well. We also forwarded the notice to additional neighborhood groups in Brentwood and West LA so that they could distribute it to their members.



I am writing to express my opposition in granting a cannabis license to the retail storefront located at 1385 W. 29th St in Los Angeles. As you know, I am opposed to cookies operating adjacent to the Brentwood Country Mart.

I am in France now and tried to join the public meeting by phone but got bumped. Pryor to being bumped, I heard the coordinator say that I would not be able to speak.

For these reasons, I am writing down my objections in the hope that they can be forwarded to the appropriate people.

We neither knew about, nor were we alerted to, the business wanting to locate adjacent to our property.

I appreciate the invitation now to share my views.

The Brentwood Country Mart is a family oriented shopping village. It has multiple offerings, services and uses that are specifically oriented to small children and their families.

Most notably, we have three private schools who drop off and pick up children in our parking lot. This serves hundreds of children per day, Monday - Friday.

A children's clothing shop, an ice cream shop, a toy shop and a bookshop are all offerings that are specifically oriented to children. These businesses are all currently operating at the Mart and most of the uses have been part of the offerings at BCM for 75 years.

As an owner / operator of a quasi public space, I have a duty to make the property safe for the children who patronise the Mart and their families. I take this duty seriously and go to great lengths to keep non conforming uses and activities out and family oriented offerings in.

We also now need to spend significant monies on private security to protect our environment. This was not the case for most of the past 20+ years.

Cookies has brought unwanted crime and smoking to our community. I understand that schools and other areas where children gather are off limits to such uses.

I urge the commission to consider the Brentwood Country Mart just such an environment in need of protecting for the sake of our children and ask that Cookies relocate to a more appropriate and suitable location.

Presented below are comments submitted on behalf of the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) regarding application no. LA-R-23-320026-ANN. Los Angeles Unified School District received a Notice of Community Meeting and Public Hearing for this application for a Type 10 – Commercial Cannabis Activity located at 11906 Wilshire Boulevard in West Los Angeles. The District expresses its disapproval of commercial cannabis sales next to its schools. According to the state Department of Cannabis Control, there are no licensed cannabis retail operation at the project address and therefore, approval of the application would introduce a new cannabis retail operation that is located 619 feet from Brockton Avenue Elementary School (204 students) and 778 feet from University High School (1,418 students) (Exhibit A – 700-foot Radius from Brockton Avenue ES). LAMC SEC. 105.02 (a)(1)(B) expressly prohibits the business premise of a commercial cannabis activity to be located less than 700 feet from the elementary school. There is an undue concentration of cannabis retail licenses next to our schools with three existing licensed cannabis retailers within a quarter mile along Wilshire Boulevard (see Exhibit B – Licensed Cannabis Retailers 0.25 Miles)

Based on the extent and location of the proposed development, LAUSD is concerned that the close proximity of commercial cannabis activity with retail storefront located a block away from our schools would facilitate exposure to and access by students at Brockton Avenue Elementary School and University High School of harmful cannabis products, the District asks not to allow the operation of commercial cannabis activity at this location.

In general, operations of cannabis dispensaries have caused concerns about these businesses ability to ensure safe environments for children and to consistently adhere to regulations that protect youth. A recent study published in JAMA Pediatrics looked at 700 licensed cannabis dispensaries in California and found that many retail locations have inadequate screening processes¹, which allows minors to enter and view items that should be restricted to adults 21 and over². In addition, the study found multiple issues with dispensaries:

- 35% of dispensaries had items that may appeal to teens and children inside retail areas
- 12% of dispensaries checked IDs prior to entering premises

- 85% of dispensaries offered promotions, first-time purchase discounts and weekly or daily deals
- 22% were in violation of California’s free sample ban for takeaway items, and
- 16% of dispensaries violated on-site consumption bans

Edibles such as the ones available in cannabis stores are particularly concerning in light of recent news reports of LA Unified students at Sun Valley Magnet School³ and Van Nuys Middle School⁴ experiencing health emergencies as a consequence of ingesting cannabis-infused edibles. From 2016-2022, marijuana-related calls to California Poison Control System (CPCS) sharply increased for children (aged <6 years) by 445%, and for adolescents (aged 6-19 years) by 151%. Legalization of marijuana retail sales in 2018 may have increased the potential for exposure to marijuana among younger individuals, who are likely to mistake marijuana edibles for normal candy and consume an entire package.⁵ These stores sell products that have the potential to expose students to excessive concentrations of pesticide, “Twenty-five of 42 legal cannabis products that The Times and WeedWeek purchased from retail stores and had tested at private labs showed concentrations of pesticides either above levels the state allows or at levels that exceed federal standards for tobacco. The contaminants include chemicals tied to cancer, liver failure, thyroid disease and genetic and neurologic harm to users and unborn children”.⁶

Declining to approve application no. LA-R-23-320026-ANN to renew its license is consistent with LAMC Section 105.00 (Purposes and Intent), which states,

“The purpose of this article is to stem the negative impacts and secondary effects associated with Cannabis related activities in the City, including, but not limited to, those documented in case law and in the legislative histories of cannabis regulations in the City, including but not limited to: neighborhood disruption and intimidation caused in part by increased transient visitors; exposure of school-age children and other residents sensitive to cannabis; cannabis sales to minors; and violent crimes.”

The District’s charge is to protect the health and safety of students and staff, and the integrity of the learning environment. Cannabis/marijuana’s well-documented harmful effects on youth are exacerbated by allowing retail sales of such products next to schools.

EXHIBIT A – 700-FOOT RADIUS FROM BROCKTON AVENUE ES

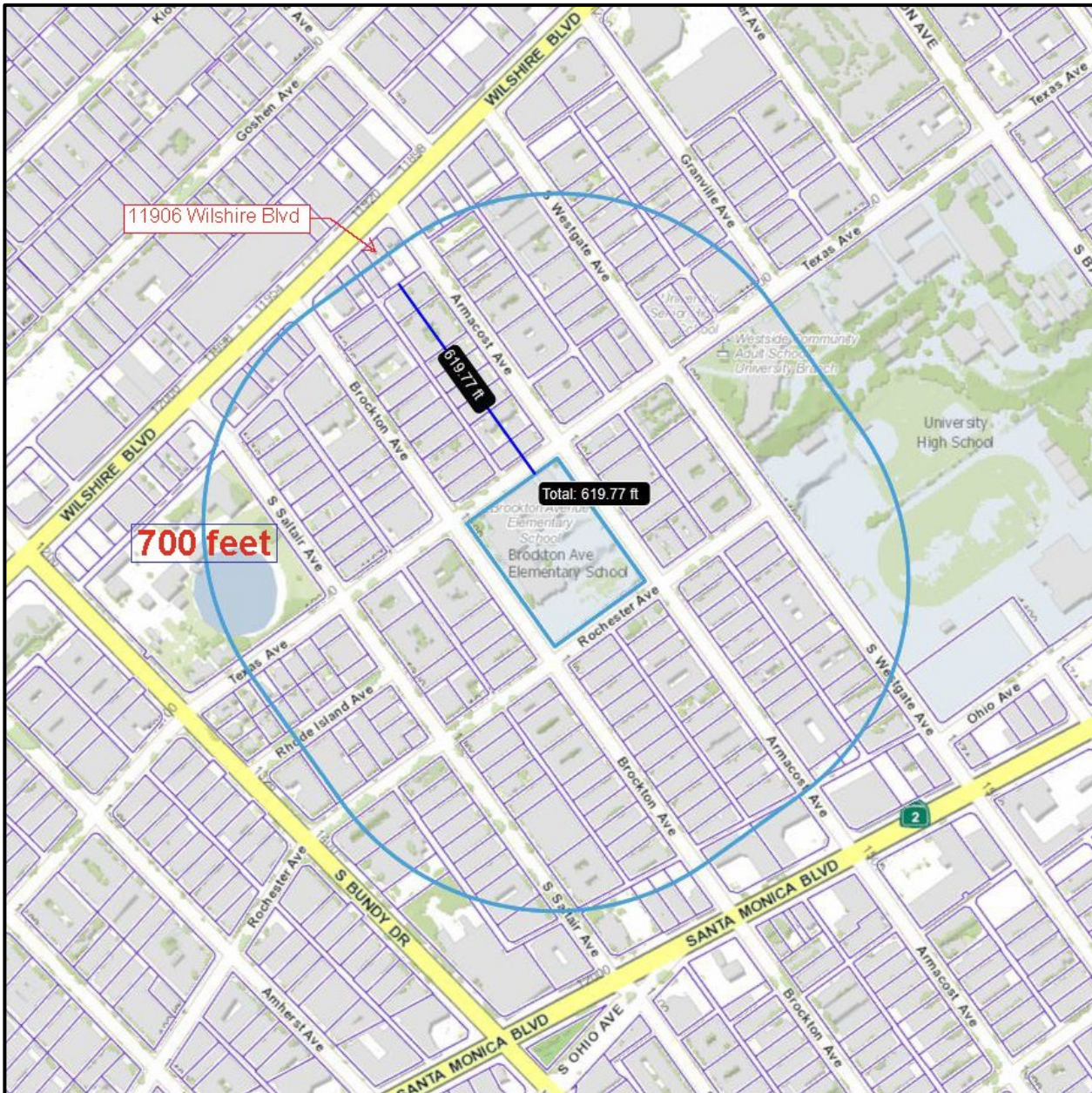


EXHIBIT B – LICENSED CANNABIS RETAILERS 0.25 MILES
